She traveled extensively and made friends easily wherever she went. She will be remembered for her radiant smile, her generosity, her open heart and her gracious gratitude for blessings great and small. Lee was loved and admired by everyone and her absence creates a void for those who loved her. She was a lifetime member and past president of Hadassah, a volunteer organization of women motivated to strengthen ties with Israel and support medical care and research for people worldwide.
